Following are the key highlights of the function:

- Sh K. Rajendra Kumar, IPS, Director General of Police, J&K was the chief guest at the prize distribution function. Speaking on the occasion, he said that imparting of training is very important for skill development and that it will go a long way in cementing the socio-economic empowerment of the state. He further talked about the success of Udaan and Umeed schemes that have resulted in several success stories of entrepreneurs. However, he added that developmental strategies and entrepreneurial education is required for eradicating financial insecurities.

7TH SAT PAUL SAHNI MEMORIAL LECTURE ON 'PROLIFERATING MEDIA: CHALLENGES OF ETHICS & ACCOUNTABILITY'

The 7th Sat Paul Sahni Memorial Lecture on 'Proliferating Media: Challenges of Ethics & Accountability' was organized by the J&K Regional Branch of Indian Institute of Public Administration on December 17, 2016. Sh. K. B. Jandial, IAS (Retd) Former Member J&K PSC, in his key note address made the following observations:

- Despite the growth of the e-media, the traditional print media has not only survived but has also thrived due to the advancement in technology.
- Although the press has proliferated, its role has undergone tremendous transformation over the years. Specifically mentioning Gandhiji Journalism, he pointed out that Gandhiji considered media as a means of serving the nation and not as a means of profit making. Through his presentation, he brought to light the need for 'Ethics in journalism'.

Following are some key highlights from other speakers on the occasion:

- Dr. S. S. Bloeria, IAS (Retd.) Former Vice Chancellor, Central University of Jammu, in his address remembered his long association with Sh. Sati Sahni. While talking about Satiji's personality, he said that his qualities of punctuality, honesty and perfectionism have rubbed off on all those that he came in touch with.
- Sh. B. R. Sharma, IAS, Ex-Chief Secretary and Chairman, IIPA J&K Regional Branch, while speaking on the occasion fondly remembered Sh. Sati Sahni and reiterated that the benchmarks for the media need to be raised since the society needs media but without its shortcomings.
- Dr. Ashok Bhan IPS (Retd.), Patron IIPA J&K Regional Branch while paying tributes to Satiji, as he is fondly remembered, said that media should be in the service of the citizens and like the purchasability of justice, purchasability of media should not become the norm.
- Sh. Chander Gulati paid rich tributes to Late Shri Sat Paul Sahni and said that he was a perfectionist and an institution in itself. He said that Sh. Sahni was a multi-dimensional personality having the privilege of covering all the four war of India and Pakistan. He said that Sh. Sahni had an eye for detail and would capture instances that are now part of a rare collection.

In memory of Late Shri Ram Sahai, one of the founding members of the Regional Branch, IIPA, J&K Regional Branch organized the 4th Shri Ram Sahai Memorial Lecture on “Demonetization” on February 25, 2017.

Shri Sanjay Kumar, Senior Advisor Deloittee, India, delivered the key note address wherein he traced back the history of demonetization and took a critical perspective on the implications of this major transformational policy of the government. According to him,

- The real benefits of demonization will accrue with time.
- Demonization has been able to take the stock of unaccounted money but hasn't been able to curb the flow of black money into the system.

- Government is leveraging data analytics which will surely bring is transformational change and improve voluntary compliance in the long run.

- Sledge hammer approach like demonetization is the way forward if the nation wants to have long term benefits.
- Gut of the common citizen surpasses the scholarly attributes and move like demonetization indicates that the citizen of India intends to participate in the governance process.

- The industry has an onus of responsibility to be a cog in the great wheel of change in this country.

The deliberations revolved around key areas of management including - Emerging Paradigms in Governance; Management competencies and good governance; Service orientation; Memory enhancement;

Effective Interpersonal communication; Leadership and team building.

Following are the key critical areas of development highlighted by the resources persons.

- All government officials are managers as they have to handle complex situations related with government programmes, human resources, schemes etc which are complex and challenging.
- Future public servants will have to develop skills which will help them to remain engaged with the public and change the negative perception associated with government employees.
- There is a transition towards participative governance making the government more accountable to the public.
- Government employees will need to update their skills and lead by example.
- There is a need for thorough knowledge of the legal provisions, norms and procedures mandatory as there is a paradigm shift in the whole idea of governance.

- The role of “ASK” i.e. attitude, skill and knowledge determine success in any job.
- There is a need for building various competencies including commitment character, confidence competences creativity and collaboration for promoting service orientation among employees.
- There is a need and significance of re-adopting the old ways of storing information such that our reliability on technology is reduced.
- Public servants can rely on the role of Neuro Linguistic Programming (NLP) for making interpersonal communication effective
- There is a need to lead the change and be a catalyst for bringing transformation in the future workplaces.

Following were the key issues deliberated during the lecture

- Jammu region has remained neglected in terms of tourism in general and eco-tourism in particular
- Draft Tourism policy must include development of eco tourism
- Local community can play a significant role in development and sustenance of eco tourism without disturbing the ecology.

- Awareness programmes within communities should be organized to project the role of eco-tourism in their economic upliftment.
- Ecologically frail areas should be conserved.
- The diverse set of natural assets of our state including mountain ranges, glaciers, waterfalls, rivers and caves should be explored for promotion of eco-tourism.
- J&K is blessed with a large number of endemic and rare plants and animals which can be promoted for promoting eco-tourism.
- The carrying capacity of an area should be considered for sustainability of eco-tourism.

According to Sh. Farooq Ahmad Shah,

- The main focus of new tourism policy will be on development of eco-tourism in the state as J&K can be projected as an ideal state for eco-tourism.
- The successful models of countries like Bhutan, Japan and European countries can be utilized for promoting eco-tourism without compulsions.

- Educational institutions should focus on applied research and the technology transfer process should be institutionalized.



REPORT RELEASE ON 'BUILDING CONFIDENCE FOR TRADE'

Bureau of 'Research on Industry & Economic Fundamentals' (BRIEF) in collaboration with Central University of Jammu (CUJ) and Indian Institute of Public Administration J&K Regional Branch organized a 'Report Release' presentation at Indian Institute of Public Administration J&K Regional Branch on November 26, 2016. The report named 'Trading Confidence: A Compelling Case for Cross LoC Trade' was prepared by Afaq Hussain and Riya Sinha from BRIEF.

Mr. B. R. Sharma, Ex-Chief Secretary, Government of Jammu & Kashmir presided over the report release as Chief Guest while Prof. Ashok Aima, Vice Chancellor, Central University of Jammu was the Guest of Honor. Mr. Mohammad Saqib, CEO, BRIEF; Sh. Rakesh Gupta, President, CCI Jammu; and Dr. Shujaat Bukhari, Editor-in-chief, Rising Kashmir were also present during this occasion.

Following are the highlights of the function:

- In his welcome address, Mr. Mohammad Saqib presented a brief introduction about the report which was launched by Mr. Omar Abdullah at New Delhi.
- Mr Afaq Hussain, co-author of the report, stated the genesis behind the project and gave a brief introduction of all the stakeholders involved. The report preparation involved field interviews with traders and businessmen in border areas of J&K and Punjab and also interviews with the traders and chambers of commerce from Pakistan through Skype.

- Shri Rakesh Gupta, reiterated that the ground realities and challenges prevail on either side of the border and are going to remain the same until and unless the bigger picture is not addressed by the governments of India and Pakistan. He added that the Jammu has a feasible trade route towards Pakistan via Sialkot as compared to Poonch route and that the government needs to consider it seriously.
- Dr. Shujaat Bukhari claimed that the cross LoC trade is not only related to its economic aspect, but also to encourage people-to-people contacts and bring peace and stability in the region.

The address was followed by discussion on the issues raised by the speakers.

Shri B. R. Sharma and Prof. Ashok Aima gave the special address which was followed by a formal vote of thanks by Prof. Alka Sharma, Director (Seminars). Dr. J Jaganthan, Assistant Professor, CUJ conducted the proceedings of the function. Er. J B S Johar, Honorary Secretary, IIPA was also present during the occasion. The function was attended by members of the civil society, various trade, commerce and industrial associations, members of IIPA and faculty /Students of Central University of Jammu.
